Dear Families, Parents and Friends

Welcome! We are very excited that your child will be joining us this coming fall which will be filled with fun, social growth, friendship, respect and lots of learning new things! Much planning, construction and hard work has gone into preparing for a successful school year. September marks the beginning of your child's high school years. Please join us for Freshmen Parent Night on Wednesday, September 5, 2018 at 6:00 PM in the Cafeteria.

We have a half day of events planned for your child starting at 7:45 a.m. This is an important day for students to learn to navigate Blue Hills, rotate through their academic schedule, make new friends and get to know their new teachers. Familiarity helps reduce anxiety. Dismissal is 11:30 a.m., and lunch is provided.

Bus transportation is provided at no cost by the Blue Hills Regional School District. Plan to be at the morning bus stop 20 minutes prior to the designated time the first few weeks of school to gauge when the bus will pick up your child. **Note:** the bus stop times may need to be adjusted by the bus company the first few weeks of school, so your patience and flexibility are much appreciated.

School Breakfast: Cost is \$1.50 per day.

School Lunch: Cost is \$2.75 per day. The application for Free and Reduced Lunch is available online at www.bluehills.org in August 2018, as well as on opening day, by request.

Family ID

All students will participate in concussion testing and must sign the anti-hazing form. Students interested in participating in sports will sign up online. Fall sports sign up is through August, 22, 2018. Go to www.bluehills.org and then click on **Family ID** under the **Athletics** tab.

September 3th - September 15th

The Student Activity fee of \$45.00 is to be paid online by credit card, debit card or e-check. This is an annual fee that must be paid by September 21, 2018. The Student Activity Fee covers school insurance, Skills USA membership, Concussion Baseline Fee and will allow students' to participate in extra-curricular activities, etc. The "Concussion Policy" is a mandatory requirement for all schools in Massachusetts. September 6th-First Day of School:

This will be a great new beginning for your child.

- ✓ The school day starts at 7:48 a.m. and dismissal is at 2:20 p.m. Bus transportation is available. Plan on having your child ready and at the bus stop 15-20 minutes earlier.
- ✓ A yearly physical exam is required of all new students enrolling to Blue Hills Regional. Students must submit a copy of their physical exam report along with immunization records. All physical examination and medical records should have been received in the Admissions Office during the summer and are forwarded to the Health Office. - ✓ **Summer Reading and Enrichment Packets** are required to be submitted. The Reading and Science assignments are an important required element of the curriculum for all the 9th grade students, as well as beneficial in preparing your child for enrollment. The results of

their completed assignments are factored into their grades of Term I in both English and Science. Parental involvement is a key factor in supporting the academic success of their children. The details of the assignments can be viewed on our website at www.bluehills.org and click on the **Academics drop down menu** and then **Summer Reading** to find the math and reading packets for 9th grade. New 10th graders can find the math, social studies, biology and English packets, too.

Freshmen Mini Exploratory will begin on Friday, September 14. Your child will be exposed to about half of the programs and then again on Friday, November 9th. There are 17 programs to explore. Please discuss each program with your child.

Freshmen Exploratory will begin on Monday, September 17th. Please make sure your child is dressed appropriately in long pants, closed toed shoes (no flip flops) and have their safety glasses that will be issued to them during the mini exploratory. Students will explore nine different career and technical majors over the first two terms. They will learn about safety, all aspects of the industry and complete hands-on projects and activities. Doing well in ALL exploratory programs is important since the overall grade average can impact final selection. Students are asked to rank their top three choices in January. Students are then placed by interest and grade. Over 80% of students are admitted to their 1st choice and 95% get their 2nd or 3rd choice. Students not placed in a major they are interested in can request to be placed on a wait list for that Career and Technical program. The students may have an opportunity to transfer into that CTE program throughout first term of 10th grade if an opening arises.
