Medical Emergency Response Plan



Blue Hills has a 2-way radio communication system. Selected personnel have a radio and will report to a designated area on campus in the event of an emergency. With after school activities, staff also has radios for communication. If an All-Call is necessary during or after school hours, Blue Hills has a system in place in which all staff is notified of the type of emergency and how to respond.

TO CONTACT THE NURSE IN A MEDICAL EMERGENCY, CHOOSE ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Dial the nurse directly (La'Lena Etheart, Julie Sera) at 2230 for an emergency
- Call the following staff who will notify the nurse.

In all cases, be prepared to state your name, victim's name, location and nature of emergency.

If student's behavior is escalating, notify administration (extensions above) and request Dean of Students and/or another Administrator immediately. See next page for additional staff trained in **conflict resolution**.

For life-threatening emergencies or immediate police assistance, please call 911.

If there is a **sports injury after school**, call the ATHLETIC TRAINER or ATHLETIC DIRECTOR.

DURING SCHOOL HOURS

Coaches are trained during September of each school year by the Athletic Director's office in CPR and first aid. Students in Health Assisting and Criminal Justice are also trained in their vocational program.
